"A Japanese chestnut tree was found growing on the bank of the river north of Hartford. It is at least 60 years old and free from blight. It was set out by a farmer named John P. Jones. In quality, the nuts are about the same as the Italian chestnuts. Scions have been taken from this tree for grafting on young trees at the Conn. station Mt. Carmel farm."
