Dear Mr. Gravatt:

Very belatedly I am complying with a request you made in a letter you wrote me on November 8, 1938, to furnish you a sketch showing the location of the Chinese chestnut trees I obtained from Mrs. Anne von Ammon, widow of the late Sigfried von Ammon. Please find the sketch enclosed.

During your absence ^{from} the city this week I had two telephone conversations with Mr. Diller about these chestnut trees. I had thought they were doomed with the chestnut blight, but after examining samples he assures me it is twig blight, a different malady and one they may be expected to overcome if given proper care.

With renewed interest I have accordingly fed and cultivated them in the manner discussed with him, and am looking forward to seeing them yet make bearing trees. He would like to visit them with me say at the end of the 1943 growing season, and I am looking ^{forward} to that pleasure, conditions permitting.

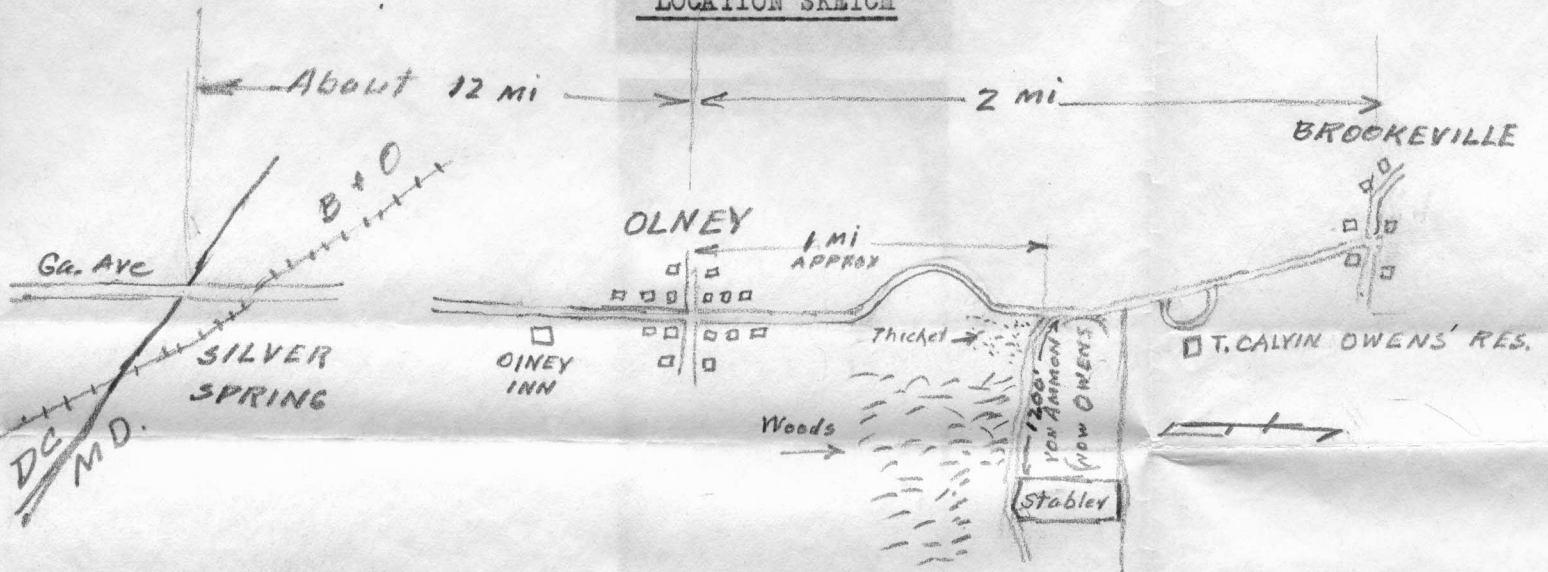

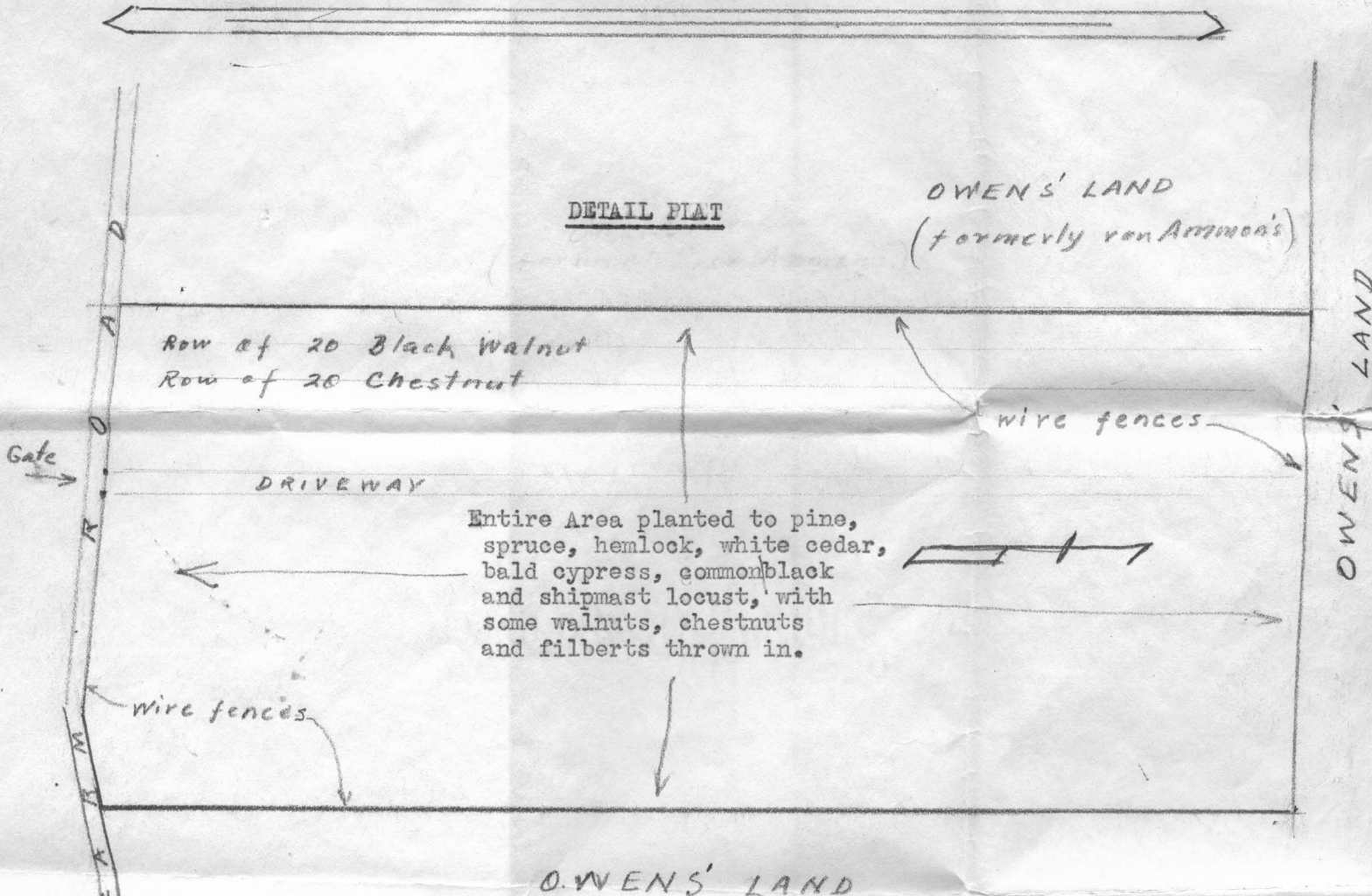
PLAT OF STABLER FORESTRY AND NURSERY HOBBY PROJECT
