- 2,000 american seedlings, 3-6 ft high, grown from nuts collected in Portland
  - 400 Chinese seedlings, 3-5 ft. high, grown from seed imported from China about 4 yrs ago.
  - 400 grafted hort. var. on amer. stock, 6-8 ft tall. Stock and scions from Portland.
  - 3-2 yr old seedlings grown from seed imported from northern China
  - 8-2 yr old seedlings grown from seed from central China.
- no chestnut blight found.
