HEARING INTERROGATORIES PURSUANT TO DIRECTION OF THE CONNECTICUT SITING COUNCIL AT THE JULY 1, 2008 HEARING DOCKET NO. 360 - CANAAN (FALLS VILLAGE) CELLCO PARTNERSHIP D/B/A VERIZON WIRELESS

Reminder: Cellco-Verizon has agreed to provide coverage maps showing the minimum projected usage and the maximum projected usage for the proposed site.

Cellco-Verizon's environmental consultant has also agreed to provide a list of all natural features and schools within the proposed coverage area.

Cellco-Verizon's environmental consultant has also agreed to identify the NDDP areas shown on the DEP map in Cellco-Verizon's Application under Docket 360, and state his findings as to the environmental basis for designating those areas based on his own site investigation and observations.

- 6. Has Cellco's attorney reviewed the risk of reversion of the land to the Town once the tower is erected?


