Dear Ms. Suhanovsky:

We are writing to you on behalf of our client, New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") in connection with AT&T's application pending before the State of Connecticut Siting Council for construction of a tower on a private parcel of land at 933 Stillwater Pond Road in Torrington. As part of AT&T's search for a suitable location in this area of the State, AT&T's representatives investigated several of the larger parcels owned by the Torrington Water Company ("TWC") associated with the Reuben Hart Reservoir and in the vicinity of Stillwater Pond. As you know, pursuant to State Statutes, Class I and Class II Watershed properties are not available for the siting of wireless facilities. See Connecticut General Statutes §§25-32(b) and 25-32(f). As such, we understand that AT&T was advised by TWC representatives that its land holdings in the area could not be made available for tower siting.

We are following up to simply ask that you confirm in writing for us that all TWC holdings in the area are Class I and II Watershed and see if you would allow us to obtain a copy of any maps you may have that demonstrate same. AT&T's hearing is currently scheduled for January 26, 2010. As such, we will follow this letter with a telephone call to try and coordinate having an AT&T representative come to your offices to review and hopefully obtain copies such maps from your staff prior to the 26<sup>th</sup>. We appreciate your time and consideration of this request.
