Dear Mr. Caruso:

The Woodstock Historic Properties Commission would like to urge the Connecticut Siting Council to be as judicious as possible in its deliberations about expanded cellular facilities in northeast Woodstock. If such facilities are deemed necessary, it is important that a configuration be found that is minimally disruptive to the landscape. The northeast corner of Woodstock is arguably one of the most scenic areas of the town, with numerous listed historic farms, and a rolling open landscape. Any alternatives of scale, design, and location that the Siting Council can pursue to minimize the visual impact of cellular facilities on this landscape will be worthy of consideration. Could facilities be placed, for example, in an existing structure?

We appreciate your consideration of these concerns in your deliberations.
