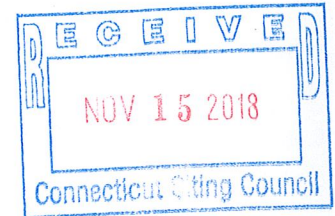

**RE: Docket No. 399 – Request for Transfer of Certificate  
166 Pawcatuck Avenue, Stonington, CT**


Dear Ms. Bachman,

This letter serves to clarify past changes in ownership of the above referenced tower facility (the “Facility”) and to formally request approval from the Connecticut Siting Council (the “Council”) for these transfers.

On August 26, 2010, T-Mobile Northeast, LLC (“T-Mobile”) was issued a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need in Docket No. 399 (the “Certificate”). The Certificate was subsequently transferred from T-Mobile to Bay Communications II, LLC on October 17, 2013. In December of 2017, Bay Communications II, LLC merged with Municipal Communications, LLC into Municipal Bay, LLC (“Municipal Bay”). During its time of ownership of the Facility, Municipal Bay complied with all of the terms and conditions of the Certificates. However since a request to transfer the Certificate was not submitted to the Council, this letter serves to notify the Council of this past transfer into Municipal Bay and to formally request a transfer of the Certificate.

Municipal Bay was subsequently acquired by American Towers LLC (“American Tower”) on September 20, 2018. As a wholly owned subsidiary of American Tower, Municipal Bay still owns the Facility. However control and operation of the Facility is now under American Tower, therefore this letter serves to notify the Council of this change in control. Attached hereto is a separate letter from American Tower which confirms this change in corporate ownership and includes contact information for any future correspondence related to the site.
