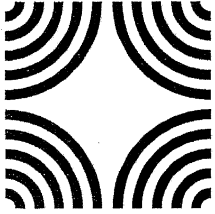

The State Historic Preservation Office is in receipt of additional information for above-referenced project, submitted for review and comment pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act and in accordance with Federal Communications Commission regulations.

While the new materials submitted indicate that the subject telecommunications tower will be visible seasonally on the distant ridge from the South Canaan Congregational Church, in the opinion of this office, the proposed undertaking will have no adverse effect on the defining characteristics of the National Register-listed building and its site.
