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Docket No. 424 The Connecticut Light and Power Company Request for Temporary Suspension of Independent Environmental Inspections Staff Report December 12, 2013

On December 4, 2013, The Connecticut Light and Power Company (CL&P) submitted a letter to the Connecticut Siting Council requesting the temporary suspension of BSC Group's Independent Environmental Inspections pending receipt of the Clean Water Act Section 404 Permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE).

Construction activities began at Card Street Substation during a planned outage in November, which consisted of the installation of temporary bus work. The installation was completed and the affected areas have been restored and stabilized with gravel. CL&P will not perform any further construction activities at Card Street Substation, nor will it initiate construction along the transmission line rights-of-way or any modifications to Lake Road Switching Station or Killingly Substation until the USACE issues the Section 404 permit. The permit is expected in March 2014.

Beginning in mid-December, material shipments will arrive for storage a laydown yards previously approved by the Council. The laydown areas will only be used for material storage until the Section 404 permit is issued.

CL&P proposes to suspend all of BSC Group's Independent Environmental Inspections for this project, including for laydown areas, until the Section 404 permit is issued and construction activities commence.

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

Request for Temporary Suspension of BSC Group Independent Environmental Inspections Pending Receipt of the Clean Water Act Section 404 Permit from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers

Dear Chairman Stein:

As an initial step in the construction of the Interstate Reliability Project (Project), during a planned outage on November 26, 2013, The Connecticut Light and Power Company's (CL&P's) contractor, ES Boulos, successfully installed temporary bus work at Card Street Substation. This work was all completed within the station fence and the affected areas have been restored and stabilized with gravel.

However, until the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) issues a Section 404 Clean Water Act permit for the Project, CL&P will not perform any further construction activities at Card Street Substation and will not initiate construction along the transmission line rights-of-way or any modifications to Lake Road Switching Station or Killingly Substation. Currently, CL&P anticipates that the USACE will issue the Section 404 permit in March 2014.

Commencing in mid-December, shipments of Project materials are scheduled to arrive for storage at the laydown yards approved by the Connecticut Siting Council (Council) on October 31, 2013. The use of these material storage sites is the only activity planned prior to the issuance of the Section 404 permit. There will be no construction activity conducted at the material laydown areas.

Because no Project construction will be performed in the upcoming months, CL&P respectfully requests that the Council suspend, including for laydown areas, its independent environmental inspections (performed weekly by the BSC Group¹) until the Section 404 permit is issued and construction activities commence.

¹ The independent environmental inspections are performed pursuant to Condition 8 of the Council's Docket No. 424 Decision and Order and the Project Development and Management Plan, Volume 1, Section 6.1. On September 20, 2013, the Council approved the BSC Group as the Independent Environmental Inspector for the Project.
