The State Historic Preservation Office is in receipt of the proposal for the above-referenced project, submitted for review and comment pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act and in accordance with Federal Communications Commission regulations.

After completing review of 15 Great Pasture Road, All-Points Technology Corporation has in their professional opinion stated that there will be no historic properties affected by the proposed installation of a 123' monopole tower and associated equipment within a 50; by 50' fenced compound at the subject property. Based on the information provided to this office, SHPO concurs that no historic properties will be affected by this undertaking.
