

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments regarding Docket No. 479.

We appreciate that the responsible parties submitted an official Notice of Proposed Construction or Alteration (Form FAA 7460-1) to the Federal Aviation Administration due to the proposed project's proximity to Igor I. Sikorsky Memorial Airport. While we understand that the FAA issued a Determination of No Hazard to Air Navigation on September 28, 2017, please note that any changes to the submitted plans will require further consultation with the FAA. Furthermore, any future construction or alterations, even if proposed in conjunction with this project, will require separate notification and consultation with the FAA. These are important steps to ensure that the FAA has the information necessary to evaluate if the projects will have any impact to navigable airspace. The CAA takes the safety of Connecticut aviation very seriously, and we thank the applicants for proactively collaborating with the FAA. We encourage the applicants to continue such coordination if project plans change in the future.
