	The Bridgeport MDT and the Center for Family Justice, the Yale Child Sexual Abuse Clinic has decided to open a satellite clinic in Bridgeport, which would make it much easier for families whose children need forensic medical exams to bring their child for an exam. An important piece of equipment for the forensic exam is the colposcope, which needs to be purchased for the satellite clinic. We have done research on different colposcopes and have decided on one that costs about \$12,000 from a company called Fernico. The Bridgeport MDT is also looking for funds to support this equipment. There is an application that will be put in to Bridgeport Hospital. There was a question around where the colposcope would sit if the satellite office was closed. Additional logistic questions arose around insurance for the equipment and location for the equipment. The funds for this will come from the CJA funds that are held at DCF.
