<p>G</p> <p>LIFE'S GOOD</p> <p>Observe your dog. Attain and maintain time in G</p>						
<p>C</p> <p>CAUTION</p> <p>Identify behaviors, attend to your dog, and guide your dog back to G</p>						
<p>D</p> <p>DANGER</p> <p>Identify and interrupt behaviors, assure your dog, and guide your dog back to G</p>
