






## Historical Perspective

- Focuses on DCF as the "solution"



#### What's Different?

- The identified SW will become imbedded in the school district and community;
- Member of the Putnam Board of Education Distribution List and school based events;
- Serve on the JRB, DKH-COC team, Early Truancy Team and the monthly special service teaming;
- Maintain a listing of committed children for whom Putnam is the nexus.
- Collect monthly data on those committed children to ensure SW are following the tenants of Raise the grade expectations. (process formulating)
- Joint training for DCF/School staff
- Participate in the development of new initiatives
