Interview Report: Sergeant Frank Cuccaro

On 06/06/2017 at approximately 1658 hours, Sergeant Frank Cuccaro at the Troop G Barracks. At that time, Sergeant Cuccaro provided a one-page typewritten statement. What appears below is a summarization of the statement with pertinent quoted segments in italics. This summary report does not constitute a full review of the complete statement of Sergeant Cuccaro, which is attached to this report.

On 05/09/2017, Sergeant Cuccaro was assigned to the west side as B-3. At approximately 1701 hours, the sergeant heard a radio transmission that Gang Unit Detective James Borrico was requesting the assistance of a marked BPD cruiser having observed a stolen vehicle in the area of Laurel Avenue and Park Avenue. Sergeant Cuccaro wrote, *“The directions continued being called out on channel 1 – right on Park Avenue, left on Washington Avenue, then a transmission came over the radio of Shots Fired, Walgreens-Fairfield Avenue.”*

Upon hearing this information, Sergeant Cuccaro proceeded towards the area from Washington Avenue near Coleman Street and arrived shortly thereafter. Sergeant Cuccaro reported, *“I observed two parties laying on the ground, handcuffed, bleeding, and what appeared to be a motor vehicle accident involving A-23 and civilian vehicles.”*

Believing he was the first supervisor on scene, Sergeant Cuccaro spoke with Ofc. Julio Diez, who advised the sergeant that *“Officer Boulay fired his weapon and was injured in the accident. I advised Officer Diez to immediately transport Officer Boulay to St. Vincent’s Hospital to be evaluated. I advised Officer Bobby Jones to transport Boulay’s partner, Officer Pecirep, to St. Vincent’s Hospital to be evaluated.”*
