### **OCTOBER 12, 2012**

**1. 8:30 AM call to order. (Reminder to everyone to place their cell phones on "silent").** Chairman Vallieres called the meeting to order at 8:28 AM.

### 2. Review Minutes of Previous Meetings:

A. Review minutes of meetings of <u>September 14, 2012</u>. After a thorough view by the Board, the minutes were approved as submitted. (Halloran/Bish)

### **3. Report from Trade Practice Division:** for review by the Board.

At the request of the Board, Mr. Richard Maloney, Director of the Department's Trade Practices Division, addressed the Board concerning complaints. He gave the Board a year-end status report regarding complaints noting the Department had received a total of 340 electrical complaints; 244 of which were related to the continuing education audit conducted by the Department. The Department had 96 complaints which include various types of complaints including many site visits. Currently, the Department has three investigators working on 49 open cases.

Mr. Maloney invited communication from the Board at any time if any Member feels that need more information or clarification on any issue they may have. He also noted that the Department has hired another Manager to take over some of his Division's duties which will now provide him with more time to attend to the various Board issues. Mr. Bish, on behalf of the Board, offered their help in any way that they can to Mr. Maloney and his investigators. Mr. Maloney will further pursue their offer and get back to them if he has any tasks they can do to assist him and his Division.

Mr. Halloran stated to Mr. Maloney that the Board will meet 15 times next year and stands at the ready. Mr. Vallieres noted that he believes the Board can be of assistance in many ways to free up more time for the investigators to do their job. Mr. Maloney agrees and is very willing to work with the Board. He also noted that the severity of electrical complaints is often only determined after a significant amount of time is invested by the Department. The Department tries to use their very limited resources in the most efficient way possible so as to organize their efforts in proportion to the severity of the complaint.

Mr. Soter cited the Board's frustration with the many cases they have uncovered concerning unregistered employee's working for electrical contractors who know that they are supposed to be registered with the Department of Labor and their employees registered in their program as apprentices. Mr. Soter noted that the penalties for this

type of violation must be severe enough to be taken seriously by the Contactors. A nominal fee can be written off by many offenders as the cost of doing business and continue on with their illegal practices

The Board thanked Mr. Maloney and his Division for their time and effort and for his appearance before the Board today. Mr. Vallieres stated that he will reach out to Mr. Maloney and his Division, on behalf of the Board, to see if some of his cases can be transferred over to the Board and to offer some suggestions relative to providing more detail on the complaint reports.
