COMPLAINT

1. This action is brought by George Jepsen, the Attorney General of the State of Connecticut (the "Attorney General"), pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. §§ 33-1038 and 33-1187(a)(4) to stop the wasting of charitable funds and to dissolve a corporation that has forfeited its charitable corporate status. The Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") has perpetuated a consistent course of conduct that (1) is inconsistent with the requirements of charitable corporations in the State of Connecticut, (2) is destructive to its charitable purpose to recognize, motivate, and reward outstanding students with financial need to pursue higher education, (3) is in conflict with and does injury to the public's interest in charitable organizations and charitable gifts, and (4) violates the Statute of Charitable Trusts, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 45a-514, and the Statute of Charitable Uses, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 47-2. This lawsuit seeks to dissolve the Foundation through its requests for appropriate injunctive relief.

COUNT ONE (Quo Warranto)

- 2. The plaintiff is George Jepsen, Attorney General of the State of Connecticut, who is authorized by Conn. Gen. Stat. § 33-1187(a)(4) to institute proceedings in the nature of *quo* warranto to dissolve a Connecticut nonstock corporation.
- 3. At all times relevant herein, the defendant, Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc., is a Connecticut nonstock corporation, incorporated in 1989 pursuant to the Nonstock Corporation Act, Conn. Gen. Stat. §§ 33-1000 et seq. The Foundation currently maintains an office in Hartford, Connecticut.
- 4. The Foundation applied for and was granted § 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status by the Internal Revenue Service on or about October 3, 1989. Additionally, the Foundation registered with the Department of Consumer Protection pursuant to the Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-175 et seq.
- 5. The Foundation's charitable purpose, as set forth in its Certificate of Incorporation is

to [provide] scholarships for study in schools of higher education beyond the high school level to persons who are graduating Hartford area high school students, to graduating students attending high schools participating in the Annual Doc Hurley Basketball Classic, and to students that have received a Doc Hurley Scholarship and are attending an undergraduate college.

At all times relevant herein and consistent with the Foundation's stated purpose, the Foundation ran a scholarship program for Hartford area, college bound students. (Exhibit 1, Affidavit of Patrice Wood, ¶¶ 4, 5, 7; and Exhibit 2, Affidavit of John C. Norman, Ph.D, ¶¶ 3, 6.)

- 6. On or about 1999, the Foundation began a Legacy Campaign to generate charitable donations to the Foundation to support its scholarship program. (Exhibit 1, Wood Affidavit, ¶¶ 4, 5; Exhibit 2, Norman Affidavit, ¶ 6; Exhibit 3, Affidavit of John Neumon, ¶¶ 15, 16.) The Legacy Campaign generated approximately 2.5 million for the Foundation over several years. (Exhibit 3, Neumon Affidavit, ¶ 16.) The charitable funds created by this campaign (the "Legacy Fund") were intended for scholarship use and the Foundation's operational costs. And only the interest generated by the Legacy Fund was to be used for these charitable purposes, i.e., it was an endowment fund. (Exhibit 1, Wood Affidavit, ¶ 5; Exhibit 3, Neumon Affidavit, ¶ 16.)
- 7. Although the Legacy Fund was given with the intent to preserve the corpus and only use the interest therefrom for the Foundation's scholarships and operational costs, the Foundation failed to protect those charitable assets. In fact, the amount remaining in the Legacy Fund had dwindled to just over \$1 million by the beginning of January 2007. (Exhibit 4, Affidavit of Michele Paige, ¶ 10.)
- 8. At about that same time and soon thereafter, the Foundation began defaulting on its required corporate filings.
- 9. The Foundation failed to file its annual report with the Connecticut Secretary of the State from 2008 to the present, as required by Conn. Gen. Stat. § 33-1243(a). (Exhibit 5, Affidavit of Cheryl Turner, ¶¶ 4, 6, 7.)
- 10. The Foundation failed to maintain its charitable registration with the Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection ("DCP"), pursuant to the Solicitation of Charitable Funds

Act (the "Solicitation Act"), Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-175 et seq., which resulted in the expiration of its registration on May 31, 2007. This DCP registration is necessary for a charity to solicit charitable donations. (Exhibit 5, Turner Affidavit, ¶¶ 4, 8.)

- The Foundation failed to file its IRS Form 990 with the Internal Revenue Service for fiscal years ending December 2008 to the present, which resulted in the Foundation's losing its $\S 501(c)(3)$ tax-exempt status on May 15, 2011. (Exhibit 5, Turner Affidavit, $\P\P 4$, 5.)
- 12. The corporate filing defaults and the lack of protections for the charitable donations in the Legacy Fund are a direct result of the Foundation's utter lack of corporate procedures, form, or internal control mechanisms.
- Of trustees who were given reports on the financial health of the Foundation or who had any oversight of or control over the financial transactions of the Foundation. Additionally, during the relevant time period, all power and control over the Foundation's assets resided only with the Executive Director. (Exhibit 1, Wood Affidavit, ¶¶ 3, 8, 9; Exhibit 2, Norman Affidavit, ¶¶ 4, 7).
- 14. Even when the board of trustees did meet, minutes of the meetings were not regularly taken, and new trustees were simply added to the board instead of being elected and voted in, as set forth in the Foundation's Bylaws. (Exhibit 1, Wood Affidavit, ¶¶ 2, 3; Exhibit 2, Norman Affidavit, ¶¶ 5.)
- 15. The corporate dysfunction of the Foundation was so pervasive that by June of 2011, the Foundation had expended all of its assets, including every penny of the Legacy Fund.

(Exhibit 4, Paige Affidavit, ¶ 10). Most importantly, though, the Foundation's dysfunction caused it to default on the payment of scholarships that it had already awarded.

- 16. Even as late as the Fall of 2013, the Foundation was soliciting charitable funds, courting new applicants for its scholarship program, and representing that it was a § 501(c)(3) tax-exempt charity on its website, all while its financial accounts were depleted, it was not registered with DCP, and it had lost its § 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. (Exhibit 3, Neumon Affidavit, ¶¶ 14, 18, 19; Exhibit 4, Paige Affidavit, ¶¶ 10; Exhibit 5, Turner Affidavit, ¶¶ 4.)
- 17. The Foundation has abused and misused its corporate status in that it has engaged in activities and conduct that are in derogation of and inconsistent with its charitable purpose; namely, it abandoned its obligation to protect the Legacy Fund for the benefit of the intended beneficiaries of those charitable gifts, in violation of the Statute of Charitable Uses, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 42-7 and the Statute of Charitable Trusts, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 45a-514, and it failed to honor numerous scholarship pledges it made to Doc Hurley scholarship recipients.
- 18. The Foundation has further abused and misused its corporate status and acted contrary to the public interest in that it held itself out to the public as a corporation but never operated as one and also in that it violated numerous provisions of the Solicitation Act, including but not limited to, § 21-190b, which prohibits soliciting charitable contributions without registering with DCP.
- 19. The Foundation's conduct and activities, as set forth in Count One, show a clear forfeit of its corporate status and merit the judicial dissolution of the Foundation, pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 33-1187 *et seq*.

COUNT TWO (Ultra Vires Acts)

- 1–18. Paragraphs 1 through 18 of Count One are hereby incorporated as paragraphs 1 through 18 of Count Two as if more fully set forth herein.
- 19. The course of conduct of the Foundation, as set forth herein, is unauthorized in that it is in derogation of and inconsistent with its Certificate of Incorporation, is contrary to the public interest and the law regarding charitable assets, and is in violation of state statutes.
- 20. The Foundation's conduct and activities, as set forth in Count Two, merit the entry of injunctive relief against the Foundation, pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 33-1038(b)(3).

DEMAND FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, the Attorney General prays for the following relief:

- 1. An order dissolving the corporate status of the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc., pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 33-1187(a)(4).
- 2. An order enjoining the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc., from any and all acts until so further ordered by the Court.
 - 3. Such other relief as the Court deems necessary.

COUNTY OF HARTFORD:

I, Patrice Wood, being duly sworn, depose and say:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen (18) and understand the obligation of an oath.
- 2. On or about 1998, I became a board member of the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") and served on the board of trustees (the "Board") until sometime in 2006. My board membership was not put to a vote of the board; rather, a previous board member said it would be a good opportunity for me, and I was welcomed aboard.
- 3. When I first started as a member of the board, it met on average about every three months. The focus of the meetings was always on the scholarship program that was run by the Foundation. The Board did not discuss or review any specifics relating to the financial status of the Foundation. It did not receive any reports relating to the finances of the Foundation. No corporate minutes were taken at the meetings, and it did not review any of the required filings of the Foundation.

- 4. In the early 2000's, as a board member, I became aware of the campaign by some of the other board members and other members of the Hartford community to raise a substantial amount of charitable donations to secure the financial health of the Foundation and its scholarship program going forward. The monies raised as a part of this campaign were referred to by members of the board as the Legacy Fund.
- 5. The Legacy Fund was intended to be a perpetual endowment fund, i.e., that interest only was to be used by the Foundation, and the use to which these funds were to be put was the annual scholarships given by the Foundation, the annual salary of an Executive Director (no more than \$50,000), and the operating costs of running the Foundation.
 - 6. I recall that the Legacy Fund raised over \$1,000,000.
- 7. In the early to mid-2000's, I became the Treasurer of the Foundation and served as Treasurer through 2006. Initially, as Treasurer, I maintained the Foundation's checkbook for its operating account. I held this bookkeeper role for less than a year. I quickly relinquished that role and served the remainder of my time as Treasurer in name only. My only responsibility (as a board member, not as the Treasurer) was to help with the selection process with the scholarship program run by the Foundation.
- 8. As Treasurer, I never received copies of any of the Foundations' financial reports, nor did I review or approve of any of the Foundation's corporate filings.
- 9. From the early 2000's until I left the Board in 2006, board meetings became less frequent. And even when we did have them, the Board did not regularly discuss or review any specifics relating to the financial status of the Foundation. The Board did not regularly receive

any financial reports of the Foundation. Corporate minutes were not regularly taken at the meetings, and the Board did not review any of the required filings of the Foundation.

- Since I left the Board in 2006, I have not served the Foundation in any respect and 10. have no knowledge of its workings.
- Since I left the Board in 2006, I learned that my name continued to be listed on 11. the Foundation's website as the Foundation's Treasurer. When I discovered this, I contacted the Foundation and asked that my name be removed. It was many, many months, if not years, until my name was removed as Treasurer of the Foundation.

COUNTY OF HARTFORD:

I, John C. Norman, being duly sworn, depose and say:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen (18) and understand the obligation of an oath.
- 2. On or about 2003, I became chairman of Board for the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation") and served in that role until on or about in 2005.
- 3. The focus of Board activity when I came onto the Board was always on the scholarship program that was administered by the Foundation. The Board reviewed information from scholarship candidates and selected college-bound greater Hartford area students to receive Doc Hurley scholarships. The Board selected recipients for two types of scholarships awarded by the Board: (1) Book Scholarships to assist recipients with the cost of academic books and related expenses, and (2) Legacy Scholarships for tuition assistance.

4. Muriel Hurley-Carter was employed by the Foundation as executive director and managed all fiscal and administrative activities for the Foundation during my tenure on the Board.

5. There were no minutes kept of Board meetings. Muriel Hurley-Carter was responsible for all documentation of Board meetings that was required by law and good fiduciary practice.

6. It was and is my understanding that there was a Legacy Fund which had been established by fundraising efforts prior to my service on the Board that was intended for scholarships and for the Foundation's operational costs.

7. During my tenure as Board chairman, the Board did not receive any reports relating to the finances of the Foundation and was not expected to discuss or review any specifics relating to the financial status of the Foundation.

COUNTY OF HARTFORD:

I, John Neumon, being duly sworn, depose and say:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen (18) and understand the obligation of an oath.
- 2. Since September 2012, I have been employed by the Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection ("DCP") as the Director of the Frauds Division. My primary responsibilities include coordinating, planning and managing all division activities.
- 3. The Frauds Division is comprised of several units, including the Charities and Financial Investigations Unit and the Investigations Unit. These units investigate alleged violations under several statutory areas, including the Connecticut Unfair Trade Practices Act, the Home Improvement Act, and the Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act.
- 4. Prior to my employment with DCP, I have been employed by several agencies in various investigative roles, including Lead Legal Investigator at the State Elections Enforcement

Commission, Legal Investigator at the Office of the Attorney General, and both Lead Social Services Investigator and Social Services Investigator at the Department of Social Services.

- 5. I have received training in numerous and various aspect of investigations including, but not limited to, interviewing techniques, financial investigations, and methods of documenting and capturing information on the internet. My education includes graduate level accounting. I am a Certified Fraud Examiner as well as a licensed attorney admitted in Connecticut.
- 6. As a part of my job responsibilities at DCP and in connection with DCP's investigation of the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation"), I interviewed or was present at interviews with Muriel Hurley-Carter, the Executive Director of the Foundation. Ms. Hurley-Carter's initial interview was informal, but additional interviews were in response to an administrative subpoena served on the Foundation. [Exhibit A, Foundation Subpoena.]
- 7. Among other things, Ms. Hurley-Carter stated that the Foundation awarded scholarships. These scholarships generally took one of two forms. One form of scholarship was called a "book scholarship" that is a one-time grant typically in the amount of \$250.00 or \$500.00 that was routinely paid directly to the bookstore of the educational institution of the recipient. The other form of scholarship was a "Doc Hurley legacy scholarship" that is an annually renewable grant of \$2,500.00.

- 8. Ms. Hurley-Carter stated that the Foundation was behind on scholarships and that she would work to "make it right".
- 9. Ms. Hurley-Carter also informed me that the Foundation had advertised and run its annual Doc Hurley Classic Basketball Tournament (the "Tournament") in December of 2011 and 2012. In fact, she stated that it had been run continuously for 38 years.
- 10. Ms. Hurley-Carter indicated that the Tournament each year was "a wash" due to the high expenses for security, insurance, and other costs related to the venue and running the events.
- In the routine course of the investigation, I periodically reviewed various web pages of the Foundation's website located at www.docscholar.org.
- 12. One of the pages I viewed on December 13, 2013 displayed the 2013 Tournament schedule. [Exhibit B, 2013 Tournament schedule.]
- On the page providing the 2013 Tournament schedule, the general public was allowed to order tickets via e-mail to muriel@docscholar.org, which is the e-mail address at which I corresponded with Ms. Hurley-Carter.
- 14. One of the pages I viewed on December 13, 2013 displayed information relating to the "Doc Hurley Scholarship Application". Applications were to be available "...no later than the second week of January 2014." [Exhibit C, 2014 Scholarship information.]
- 15. One of the pages I viewed on January 17, 2014 displayed information relating to the "Doc Hurley Legacy Campaign". The page reads that "The establishment of this

- program will ensure that Doc's legacy of commitment to youth, education and community continues into the future." [Exhibit D, Legacy Campaign.]
- 16. Further, the Legacy Campaign reads that, "an endowment was established with a goal of 3 million dollars. To date the legacy campaign has generated approximately 2.5 million in donations and pledges." [Exhibit D, Legacy Campaign.]
- 17. One of the pages I viewed on November 6, 2013 was the home page of the Foundation located at docscholar.org. [Exhibit E, Foundation November Home page.]
- The home page on that date read that "Gifts may be payable to: Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. 103 Woodland Street, Hartford, CT 06105." [Exhibit E, Foundation November Home page.]
- 19. Further the home page on that date read that "The Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. is a registered 501 (c) 3. Tax ID # 22-2997358." [Exhibit E, Foundation November Home page.]
- On November 6, 2013 I personally handed Ms. Hurley-Carter a letter signed by the Commissioner of Consumer Protection stating that the Foundation must immediately cease and desist from all fundraising activities and making any misrepresentations, such as the fact that the Foundation may be a "a registered 501 (c) 3". [Exhibit F, Cease and Desist Letter.]
- On November 6, 2013 Ms. Hurley-Carter stated to me at that time that she would have the statement regarding the 501 (c) (3) status removed from the website until such time as the Foundation regained that status.

- 22. The most recent version of the Foundation's home page does not represent that the Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) organization, but rather reads to discuss the mission of the Foundation and the scholarship program. [Exhibit G, Foundation January Home page.]
- On January 21, 2014 in response to my inquiry about the underlying registrant of www.docscholar.org, I received an e-mail from "DomainsByProxy", which is a proxy registration company. In that e-mail DomainsByProxy indicated that the underlying registrant is listed as Muriel Hurley-Carter, Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. [Exhibit H, Webpage registration.]





COUNTY OF HARTFORD:

- I, Michele Paige, being duly sworn, depose and say:
- 1. I am over the age of eighteen (18) and understand the obligation of an oath.
- 2. Since February 22, 2013, I have been employed by the Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection ("DCP") within the Frauds Division as an Accounts Examiner. My responsibilities include, but are not limited to: conducting or participating in examinations of financial records and documents of organizations which are monitored by the state; preparing for examinations by reviewing prior audit reports, financial statements, budgets or other available data; preparing for on-site audit meetings to discuss audit procedures and obtain necessary information and records; examining and reconciling accounting records with supporting data; determining compliance of financial records with applicable regulations; examining accounting methods and procedures to ensure compliance with accepted accounting principles, laws and

regulations, and state or federal requirements; preparing unit reports explaining results and making recommendations.

- 3. Prior to my employment with DCP, I worked as an auditor for the Auditors of Public Accounts, State of Connecticut.
- 4. I have a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, a Master of Science in Accounting and Taxation, and a Master in Business Administration degree from the University of Hartford. I am a licensed Certified Public Accountant in the State of Connecticut.
- 5. As a part of my job responsibilities at DCP, I reviewed and analyzed various Webster Bank statements of the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation"), that DCP received from Muriel Hurley Carter, the Executive Director of the Foundation. The statements were provided by Ms. Hurley Carter to DCP in response to a subpoena served on the Foundation.
- 6. During the meeting that Ms. Hurley Carter provided the requested information she stated that the Foundation had only three financial accounts, all with Webster Bank.
- 7. Based upon the information contained in the Webster Bank statements, DCP subpoenaed all of the Foundation's financial records from Webster Bank from 2005 to the present. Ms. Hurley Carter, as Executive Director, consented to the release of the information in order to expedite the request. Webster Bank produced those records, and I have reviewed and analyzed all of these financial documents.
- 8. In addition to these documents, I have retrieved the Foundation's IRS Forms 990 from FoundationCenter.org for the time period of 2003 to 2007. The Foundation was a

§501(c)(3) tax-exempt entity during this time period. All §501(c)(3) tax-exempt entities are required to file annually the IRS Form 990. I have reviewed these documents, too.

- 9. The documents show that on January 1, 2003, the Foundation had \$1,655,984 in net assets. This total was due in large part to the substantial contributions made to the Foundation in the amount of \$809,607 in calendar year 1999 and in the amount of \$955,749 in calendar year 2000.
- 10. The Foundation's assets decreased over the next seven years and were completely depleted on June 2, 2011. The descent in assets followed this path:

I, Cheryl A. Turner, being duly sworn, depose and say:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen (18) and understand the obligation of an oath.
- 2. I am employed as a Paralegal Specialist II in the Connecticut Attorney General's Office, assisting with the investigation and enforcement of cases concerning public charities.
- 3. I have been assisting with the investigation of the corporate practices of the Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc. (the "Foundation").
- 4. Early on in our investigation, on or around November, 2013, I researched the corporate, charitable registration, and tax-exempt status of the Foundation. I reviewed the tax-exempt status of the Foundation on the Internal Revenue Service website and found that the Foundation had lost its 501(c)(3) tax exempt status and was listed on the Automatic Revocation of Exemption List. I also reviewed the corporate filing status of the Foundation on the Connecticut Secretary of the State's website and found that the Foundation last filed an annual

report in 2007. In addition, I reviewed the Department of Consumer Protection's website and found that the charitable solicitation registration status of the organization had expired in May of 2007.

- 5. On January 14, 2014, I again researched the website of the Internal Revenue Service, to review the tax-exempt status of the Foundation. The Foundation is listed on the "Automatic Revocation of Exemption List" as having lost its 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status on May 15, 2011, after failing to file its I.R.S. Form 990 for three consecutive years. A copy of the IRS website page showing the Foundation on the Automatic Revocation of Exemption List is attached as **Exhibit A**.
- 6. Also on January 14, 2014, I again researched the business filings of the Foundation on the Connecticut Secretary of the State's website. I found that the last annual report filed by the organization was filed on August 17, 2007. A copy of the filings history webpage for the Foundation is attached as **Exhibit B**.
- 7. Also on January 14, 2014, I requested from the Commercial Recording Division of the Office of the Secretary of the State, via electronic mail, certified copies of the following documents, which were filed by the Foundation with the Connecticut Secretary of State: Incorporation document, Amendment, Org. Report, RNST/RPT 2001, and 2007 Annual report, in addition to any and all documents filed with the Secretary of State after the last filing (2007) as shown on the business filings (CONCORD) database. Certified copies of the requested corporate documents are attached as **Exhibit C**.

8. On January 14, 2014, I also again researched the Foundation's charities registration status with the Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection ("DCP") and learned that the Foundation had failed to maintain its charitable registration with DCP, pursuant to the Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act, Conn. Gen. Stat. § 21a-175 et seq., which resulted in the expiration of its registration on May 31, 2007. This DCP registration is necessary for a charity to solicit charitable donations. A copy of the DCP website, specifically the "verify a license" look up page indicating registration expiration is attached as **Exhibit D**.

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION DOC HURLEY SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION, INC. (NONSTOCK CORPORATION)

We, the Incorporators, certify that we hereby associate ourselves as a body politic and corporate under the Nonstock Corporation Act of the State of Connecticut.

- 1. The name of the Corporation is: Doc Hurley Scholarship Foundation, Inc.
- purposes to be promoted or carried out by the Corporation, shall be exclusively charitable and educational, and shall be limited to providing scholarships for study in schools of higher education beyond the high school level to persons who are graduating Hartford area high school students, to graduating students attending high schools participating in the Annual Doc Hurley Basketball Classic, and to students that have received a Doc Hurley Scholarship and are attending an undergraduate college.
- 3. The Corporation is non-profit and shall not have or issue shares of stock or pay dividends.
 - 4. The Corporation shall have no members.
- 5. A Board of Trustees consisting of thirteen (13) persons shall constitute the governing body of the Corporation. The initial Trustees of the Corporation shall be elected by the Incorporators. Thereafter, the election of Trustees shall be as

prescribed in the Bylaws. which shall establish the qualifications, term of office and other requirements for such position.

- 6. The duration of the Corporation shall be unlimited.
- No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its Trustees, Officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 2 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (hereinafter referred to by Section reference) as a charitable and educational organization described in Section 501(c)(3).

For any period during which it is a "private foundation," as defined in Section 509, the Corporation shall distribute its income for each taxable year at such time and in such manner as

not to become subject to the tax on undistributed income imposed by Section 4942.

Among the activities in which the Corporation shall not engage for any period during which it is such a "private foundation are:

- (i) any act of self-dealing (as defined in Section 4941(d));
- (ii) retaining any excess business holdings (as defined in Section 4943(c));
- (iii) making any investment in such manner as to subject the Foundation to tax under section 4944; and
- (iv) making any taxable expenditure (as defined in Section 4945(d)).
- 8. The Corporation shall have all the powers and privileges which by the laws of the State of Connecticut are or may hereafter be conferred upon corporations without capital stock; provided, however, that no such powers and privileges may be exercised, nor shall any activities be conducted, by the Corporation if the same are inconsistent with the Corporation's exclusively charitable and educational purposes or are not permitted a corporation so exempt for federal income tax under Section 501(a).
 - 9. In the event of dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of any remaining assets of the Corporation to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable or

educational purposes as shall at the tire qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(a) as an organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3), as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Superior Court of Hartford County, Connecticut, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

10. Throughout this Certificate, reference to any Section shall be deemed to refer to a section of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as it hereinafter may be amended, and to the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law.


