Landmark Community Theatre	Thomaston	Replace an antiquated and poorly functioning assisted listening system and to train front of house staff in use of the system.	\$3,000
Music Haven	New Haven	Translate materials & meetings with parents in Spanish to increase communication. Support growing number of students with parents who speak limited English.	\$3,000
New Britain Youth Theater	New Britain	To increase accessibility for three upcoming productions by increasing support for participants.	\$3,000
