

Re: Change to the List of Reportable Diseases, Emergency Illnesses and Health Conditions

Dear Colleagues:

To date, the Department of Public Health (DPH) has received reports of 18 Connecticut residents with lung injury potentially related to vaping in what appears to be a growing epidemic both nationally and in our state. To better understand the magnitude of this disease so that informed efforts may be undertaken to address it, DPH is participating in an investigation of the disease in collaboration with the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

In an effort to further the objectives of this investigation, as Commissioner of DPH, I hereby amend the List of Reportable Diseases, Emergency Illnesses and Health Conditions by adding "unexplained vapingrelated lung injuries" to such list, effective September 27, 2019. This action is taken pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 19a- 2a and Section 19a-36-A7 of the Public Health Code.

Cases of unexplained vaping-related lung injury shall be reported immediately to DPH and to the local department of health in the town of residence of the case-patient by telephone on the day of recognition or strong suspicion of the disease. A report form provided by DPH shall be used to collect information on hospitalized and fatal case-patients. DPH will share these reports with the local health department in the town of residence of the case-patients.
