<b>Introduction and Review of Minutes</b>	Minutes from the 12/11/17 meeting were reviewed.	Approved
<b>Participant Updates</b>	<p>Julie Revaz will be stepping down as tri-chair and Barbara Lanza will be taking over her role in the ADPC and the CJ subcommittee. Barbara is the Manager of Adult Programs, and she oversees the AICs and ABHS programs statewide. In addition, Julie will get another JB CSSD representative from the juvenile side.</p> <p>DMHAS was awarded year 2 of the State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis grant (STR).</p> <p>Hartford Correctional became licensed to treat people using methadone. Osborn and York's licenses are pending.</p> <p>The Singer Foundation will financially support the Early Screening and Intervention (ESI) expansion into Norwich/New London.</p> <p>DOC published a peer review paper in the Journal of Addiction Medicine on the evaluation of the New Haven Correctional methadone program.</p>	
<b>Expanding Correctional MAT in CT</b>	Sam Marullo and Patrick Hulin, Yale law students, presented on their work in Rhode Island to expand MAT into corrections. Data was presented to show that providing MAT in CT jails/prisons ensures health equity, saves lives, and reduces costs. They are working on legislation in CT expand MAT into CT's correctional system.	
<b>PA 17-131/HB 7052 Workgroup Update</b>	The workgroup drafted a report on programs used by police departments to refer people with substance use problems to treatment. The final report will be submitted to the CT General Assembly by February 1, 2018 as required by the Public Act.	The report will be distributed to the sub-committee and will be discussed at the next ADPC meeting.
<b>Justice System Inventory of Services</b>		Reminder for agencies to add programs and pilots to the spreadsheets.
<b>Development of Subcommittee Goals and Objectives</b>	The group discussed the presentation on expanding correctional MAT in CT. While the group may be in favor or having this recommendation presented for approval by the ADPC, it requires funding.	Loel and Inés will get suggestions on how to proceed by the DMHAS and DCF ADPC staffers.
