<b>MAT Status at DOC</b>	There are 6 MAT programs: 3 in jails, 1 in prison, and 2 in jail/prison treating approximately 200 people per day. Expansion of MAT in the corrections system is included in the budget.

<b>Participant Update</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Wheeler Clinic received a \$2.5 million grant to work with 16-25 years old with SUD through the Hartford's Health and Wellness Center.</li> <li>• Wheeler Clinic is taking over St. Mary's Hospital's outpatient services at some point in 2019.</li> <li>• Wheeler Clinic received a \$150K grant to hire a recovery coach to work with those with an opioid use disorder, primarily in Bristol and surrounding areas.</li> <li>• Wheeler Clinic obtained a grant through SAMHSA to hire an outreach worker, MAT nurse prescriber, and a peer specialist to provide services in the New Britain area.</li> </ul>
