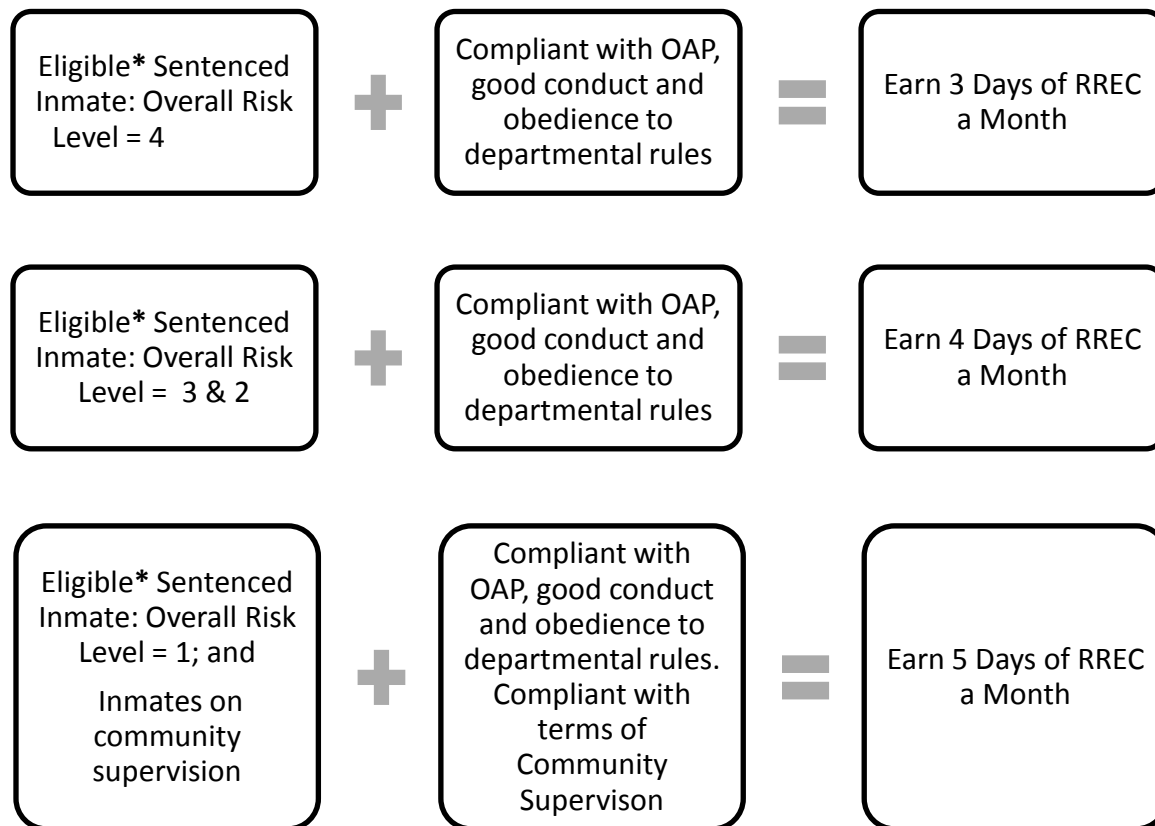




Risk Reduction Earned Credit Grid Connecticut Department of Correction

Earning Risk Reduction Earned Credit (RREC): RREC may be awarded to eligible* inmates who are compliant with their Offender Accountability Plan (OAP), participate in programs or education while maintaining good conduct and obedience to departmental rules. Offenders refusing to submit DNA, refusing to comply with sex offender requirements, or refusing to sign their OAP shall not earn RREC.



*An inmate sentenced to one of these ineligible offenses cannot earn RREC: 53a-54a, 53a-54b, 53a-54c, 53a-54d, 53a-55, 53a-55a, 53a-70a, 53a-70c, and 53a-100aa or is a persistent dangerous felony offender or persistent dangerous sexual offender pursuant to section 53a-40. RREC shall not reduce the mandatory portion of a sentence. Inmates in a restrictive status (Administrative Segregation, Special Needs, Chronic Discipline or Security Risk Group) shall not earn RREC.



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Lump Sum RREC Award: An inmate **may be** eligible to receive a lump sum RREC award, not to exceed amount allowed by statute. The Unit Administrator or designee may grant this award every 24 months if the following criteria is met:

- The earliest an inmate can apply is February 1, 2018
- The lump sum shall not exceed the statutory maximum of 60 days a year
- Discipline free within the past 24 months
- Active program participation or completion to include a job, education or vocational programing
- No increase in the overall risk level or returned from discretionary parole within the past 24 months
- No restrictive status removals within the past 4 years
- No previous RREC lump sum award within the past 24 months
- Inmates who maintained an overall 1 or released on parole during the 24 month time period will NOT be permitted to apply for credit
- Inmates may not apply retroactively

Forfeiture of Risk Reduction Earned Credits (RREC): An inmate shall forfeit RREC based on the following as designated in A.D. 4.2A Attachment B, Digest of RREC Rules:

Class A Disciplinary Report	=	Loss of 15 days of RREC
Class A Disciplinary Report: Direct Assault on a DOC Employee, Arson, Creating a Disturbance, Escape from DOC Facility, Felonious Misconduct, Hostage Holding of a DOC employee, Impeding Order, or Riot	=	Minimum loss of 60 days of RREC. More days may be forfeited at DHO's discretion for significant incidents.
Class B Disciplinary Report	=	Loss of 10 days of RREC



Risk Reduction Earned Credit Grid Connecticut Department of Correction

Violation of DOC authorized release	==	Loss of 15 days of RREC
Escape from DOC Authorized Release	==	Loss of 25 days of RREC. Will not earn for month of escape and until returned to custody
Refusal/Removal of Institutional Programming (ROIP)	==	Loss of 25 days of RREC
Violation of Parole	==	Technical=loss of 10 days* Criminal violation or absconding=loss of 25 days. Those on absconder status will not earn for the month of escape and until returned to custody. *

* Forfeiture recommendation by Department of Correction. The Board of Pardons and Paroles retains the discretion to order forfeiture of any amount of previously earned RREC.
