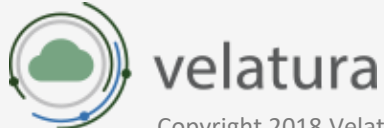
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# Question 1: What will we have done?

Summary of Advisory Council responses:

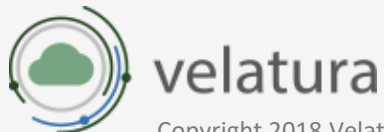
- Sustainable financial model
