CON Exemption Request Pursuant to Section 19a-639(b), of the C.G.S.

Establishment and Operation a Free Primary Care Mobile Clinic in Waterbury

Dear Mr.Culhane:

On March 6, 2009, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received your application for exemption from the Certificate of Need ("CON") process, pursuant to Section 19a-639(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S."), for the establishment of a free primary care mobile clinic for individuals in Waterbury.

Upon review of the information submitted in your request, OHCA makes the following findings:

- 1. Malta House of Care Waterbury, Inc ("Applicant") is a non-profit corporation that proposes to establish and operate a free primary care mobile clinic in Waterbury, CT. The service will utilize a mobile van which will travel to the following locations in Waterbury on an established schedule:
 - Sacred Heart Church, 13 Wolcott Street;
 - Saint Margaret Church, 289 Willow Street;
 - Saint Francis Church, 625 Baldwin Street; and
 - Saint Stanislaus Church, 36 East Farms Street.
- 2. Although it is a separate legal entity, the Applicant stated that the project will be modeled after the Malta House of Care, Inc. mobile clinic in Hartford, which is licensed as an outpatient clinic.

- 3. The Applicant's mission for the proposal is to provide primary care services and related medications to the uninsured population of the greater Waterbury area at no cost to its clients.
- 4. Primary care services are to include internal medicine, gynecological and pediatric care. The Applicant will refer patients to area hospitals for secondary or tertiary care.
- 5. The Connecticut Department of Public Health ("DPH"), in a letter dated February 27, 2009, from Commissioner J. Robert Galvin, M.D., M.P.H., M.B.A., is supportive of the Applicant's proposal and recommends an exemption under C.G.S. Section 19a-639(b) for the Applicant to provide a free primary care mobile clinic in Waterbury, CT.
- 6. DPH stated that "Currently there is only a single Community Health Center corporation providing services to the underinsured and uninsured in the city of Waterbury and the unmet health care needs of the uninsured remains a significant public health issue".
- 7. The Applicant will be seeking DPH licensure as an outpatient clinic.
- 8. The Applicant intends to staff the proposed clinic with volunteer doctors, nurses, and other individuals.
- 9. The total capital expenditure associated with the proposal is \$30,000.
- 10. The operation of the clinic will begin in the summer of 2009.

Based on the above findings, OHCA has determined that the establishment and operation of a free primary care mobile clinic in Waterbury, CT, meets the exemption requirements of Section 19a-639(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes and, therefore, is exempt from OHCA's CON process. Termination of these services would require CON approval pursuant to Section 19a-638, C.G.S.
