Establishment of a New Health Care Facility

Dear Dr. Gagnon:

On February 4, 2015, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received your Certificate of Need ("CON") Determination request on behalf of Peace of Mind Brain Injury Services, Inc. ("Petitioner") with respect to the establishment of a new facility in Westbrook, Connecticut.

The Petitioner is seeking an outpatient mental health facility license and wishes to establish a nonprofit facility in Westbrook, Connecticut that will provide services to individuals who have suffered a brain injury or suffer from Post Traumatic Stress. The Petitioner will also focus on the caregivers and families of these individuals. Specifically, the Petitioner will offer the following services: mental health, stress management, nutrition, holistic health, financial and legal planning, organization and general well being. The Petitioner does not have a contract with, or certified or licensed to provide a service for, a state agency or department.

Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 19a-638(a)(1), a certificate of need is required for the "establishment of a new health care facility". Conn. Gen. Stat. § 19a-630(10) defines a health care facility as "...(G) mental health facilities...". The Petitioner's facility will provide mental health services. As a result, the Petitioner's proposed facility fits within the definition of a health care facility. Consequently, a *CON is required* for the Petitioner's proposal.
