## Big Takeaway

In the end, Stellununa and her bird friends discuss how they feel so different yet are so much alike. Find evidence from the story to support that. Think about your families at home, at school, throughout your sports and activities. In what ways do you fit in with those families? In what ways are you different? Connect that to Stellaluna's experiences.
