The facts are explicit and clear. Photographs assist readers in understanding the written text. Text is represented as subheadings, labels, and maps. There are also question and answer bubbles in some sections.</p>	
Prior Knowledge Demands		Language Features	
<p>Some knowledge of other mammals and their habitats. Where different animals live and what they eat and even how they care for their young. Basic understanding of nonfiction text features and what 'key details' means.</p>		<p>This is an informational nonfiction text that is a very straightforward with content-specific vocabulary. There is a picture glossary and word bank are included at the end of the text. Marsh uses a variety of sentence structures including sequence and comparison sentences.</p>	
Potential Reader/Task Challenges			
<p>This text does have a lot of information and new vocabulary. Text content vocabulary can be challenging at times. The main idea of the text is to highlight the life of a koala. Based on individual classes, students may struggle with sitting attentively for the whole story and their abilities to retain all of their new leanings maybe challenging for some students.</p>			
Big Takeaway			
<p>By reading this non-fiction text students will be able to recall information gathered from the text to learn all about the lives of a Koala bears. (W.K.8) Students will know where Koalas live, what they eat, how they care for their young and why they are in danger.</p>
