Governor Rell To Kick Off 2009 Summer Reading Challenge

Governor M. Jodi Rell will join local schoolchildren and other state officials at the State Library on Thursday at 11 a.m. to kick off the 2009 Governor's Summer Reading Challenge, an annual campaign encouraging students to explore the world through books during summer vacation.

The Governor's Summer Reading Challenge began in 1996 and since then it is estimated that Connecticut students have read more than 7 million books.

"Our local public libraries are wonderful resources anytime of the year, but especially in summer when school is out," Governor Rell said. "A library card is a passport to a lifetime of learning."

The Governor also will be joined by State Education Commissioner Mark K. McQuillan and State Librarian Kendall F. Wiggin to recognize and honor the 19 top performing schools in the 2008 Summer Reading Challenge. Schools compete based on student population and grade level. The program identifies the schools with the highest books-per-student count and highest participation.
