CSDE Recognizes Districts Selected to Receive USDA's U.S. Healthier School Challenge Award

(Hartford, CT) — The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) announced today that 40 schools have been certified by the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) *HealthierUS School Challenge* (HUSSC) to receive USDA's Silver and Bronze Awards. According to the USDA, these Connecticut schools join a very select group of 1,504 schools throughout America that are certified as HUSSC schools and only 1 percent of the schools in the nation have qualified to date.

The HUSSC is a voluntary national certification initiative for schools participating in the National School Lunch Program. It supports First Lady Michelle Obama's Let's Move campaign by recognizing schools that are creating healthier school environments through their promotion of good nutrition and physical activity.

"The HUSSC encourages schools to strengthen their focus on nutrition, healthy eating and physical activity during the school day. It spotlights and recognizes those schools that emphasize wellness which further facilitates the Department's and the State Board of Education's initiatives in promoting a school environment that supports students' health and learning," said Commissioner of Education, Stefan Pryor.

The goal of the HUSSC is to improve the health of the Nation's children by creating a healthier school setting. To help meet the goal, the Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) identifies schools that have made changes to their National School Lunch Program by:

- improving the quality of the foods served;
- providing students with nutrition education; and
- providing students with physical education and opportunities for physical activity.

These goals have a clear link to improved student achievement outcomes such as increased attendance, improved standardized test scores and better classroom behavior.

The USDA will award each of the following Connecticut schools \$500 per school achieving the Bronze status and \$1,000 per school achieving the Silver status for the HUSSC. To meet the Bronze status, a school must be enrolled as a Team Nutrition School, offer reimbursable lunches that demonstrate the principles of the *Dietary Guidelines for Americans* and meet USDA nutrition standards, provide nutrition education to students, provide students opportunities to engage in physical activity, adhere to guidelines established by the FNS for all foods served/sold in schools, and implement a Local Wellness Policy. In order to reach the Silver status, the school must meet all of the above Bronze requirements and maintain an average daily participation for reimbursable lunches of at least 60 percent (of school enrollment) for elementary and middle schools and at least 45 percent (of school enrollment) for high schools.
