### **School Health Services Resources**

The Connecticut State Department of Education's Health Promotion Services/School Nurse Program provides consultation to school nurses, school nurse leaders, school administrators and the community regarding the health and safety of students. This consultation and technical assistance includes addressing the provisions of health services during the school day and the promotion of health and wellness activities that support student achievement. Professional development programs are periodically organized to further assist and support school nurses. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) School Health Service Resources (SHSR) is a user-friendly Web tool to help school health professionals and other school district staff locate all of CDC's school health services resources in one location. SHSR covers a wide range of school health topics, grouped under the following categories:

- wellness and preventative care;
- chronic health conditions;
- mental health conditions;
- episodic/acute conditions and diseases; and
- health disparities.


