Thank you for your efforts last year with the [Health Services Program Information Survey \(Survey\)](#).

Section 13 of Public Act No. 17-68, *An Act Concerning Various Revisions and Additions to the Education Statutes* requires that for the school year commencing July 1, 2017, and each school year thereafter, each local and regional board of education must complete the full [Survey](#) that includes concussion questions as mandated by [Section 10-149e of the Connecticut General Statutes](#).

All [Surveys](#) **MUST** be completed by June 1, 2018, to allow adequate time for data analysis. All information needed to complete the [Survey](#) will be available on the [EdAdvance Web site](#) by February 1, 2018.

School Nurse Coordinators/Supervisors will need to gather data from each school in their local or regional school districts. Each school nurse will need to provide school level data as of February 1, 2018. Only one survey per school district is accepted by the Survey Administrator.
