FINAL DECISION AND ORDER

ISSUES:

1. Did the Board provide the Student a free, appropriate, public education (FAPE) in the least restrictive environment (LRE) during the 2010-2011 school year, including summer session?
2. Did the Board provide the Student a FAPE in the LRE during the 2011-2012 school year, including summer session?
3. a. Did the Board propose an educational placement that would provide the Student a FAPE in the LRE for the 2012-2013 school year?
b. If not, was the Parents' unilateral placement appropriate?

SUMMARY:

A special education due process hearing was requested by the Parent's attorney and received by the Board on November 13, 2012. Attorney Laviano appeared on behalf of the Parent and Attorney Laubin on behalf of the Board during a telephonic pre-hearing conference on December 11, 2012. During the pre-hearing conference, Attorney Laviano requested a 30-day extension, to which Attorney Laubin agreed. The motion for extension was granted and the deadline for the final decision and order was extended to February 28, 2013. On February 16, 2013, pursuant to a settlement agreement between the parties, Attorney Laviano withdrew the request for a due process hearing.

FINAL DECISION AND ORDER:

The matter is **DISMISSED** with prejudice.
