About 1 mile from town on Meridianville Rd. (Rte 24)
on left side. One tree C. dentata, 20" DBH started dying yrs
ago and died almost completely this summer. Green over-
cast trunk up to 2 1/2 ft. CB is present all over lower
trunk.

Only living tree is in fruit orchard at end of grape arbor.
15 ft. high DBH 6". Tree rather stubby. Some dying in top
but very little recently. Large scar on east side trunk 6" from
base to 2 ft up. X 3" wide wood is rotting where exposed. This
is probably C. rosea but may be hybrid. Note collected. Very
good crop but nuts stick to the burr so after better drop to ground
opened. Could find no CB on tree. Mr. Dilworth could use 20 Asiatics
and has room for them.
