Have three flourishing plants, 3½ feet in height with a spread of 4½ feet. Beautiful foliage-ornamental. Adapted to this locality. Have two older trees (7 years) which have been fruiting 2 years (July 29, 1912).

1/23/31 - In a telephone conversation with C.A. Reed he advised that Morris wrote to Dr. Fairchild 8/23/13 that the 3 young trees of FPI*21875 were doing very nicely. Mr. Reed visited Dr. Morris and inspected these trees in the fall of 1930. The 3 lots of nuts sent in 1930 (Hort. Jour. No. 1061, 1062, and 1063) were from these trees. The 4th lot (Hort. Jour. No. 1060) was from a hybrid tree of his own crossing (*C. mollissima* x *pumila*)
