In letter of this date Dr. Morris states that in a block of 25 chestnuts of this variety all were dead at the end of 6 years, while Korean chestnuts growing in this block were not infected. (Dr. Robt. T. Morris, 616 Madison Avenue, N.Y.)

10/23/29 - Advises Korean blight resistant chestnuts would make good fence posts; does not know about telephone poles as his trees branch near ground, even when grown in coppice. ~~W~~
Not highly blight resistant.

6/6/28 - "In regard to the various chestnuts tried out on my country place at Stamford, Conn, I can make a group report which will cover all of the practical points. 1 tree of C. moll. reached height of about 25 feet before going down with the blight and bore several crops of first-rate nuts. 2 other trees of this species went down with blight after they had reached about 20 ft. in height and had borne a few crops. *own*
