1/13/28 - 25 #65861 - C. moll.

8/7/34 none at home. Two trees only found along driveway, 4' high.  
Dec. 1930. 5 trees thriving; 1 large amer. chest.  
not touched by blight. (over)

4/15/36. 3 living + healthy but slow growth. More  
like shrubs than trees - "certainly of different type than  
our native chestnuts. Cow ate the other 22 trees which  
were planted in pasture.

10/11/39 - 2 trees alive; mechanical injuries  
caused death of others. These 2 trees grow  
slowly, more like hardy shrubs; no  
fruit yet. Trees in close proximity to  
✓ 1/11/46. He knows of a native tree that was  
in full bloom this year.

11/7/47 The Chinese Chestnuts bore several  
nuts but few full size ones.

4/15/36 Three of the trees are still living  
that were received in 1928.

The other 22 trees were eaten by  
the cow! There are a few  
trees near by that bore nuts.

7/11/46 - only 2 now living & now only 7 to 8 ft  
tall.
