HANOVER, INDIANA

"At the william Mooney country place near Hanover the planting consisted mainly of 400 grafted Chinese chestnut trees, set in orchard form 40 feet apart, and 500 small Chinese chestnut seedlings, put in Mr. Mooney's farm nursery to be grafted later, a few grafted hickories some hardy Northern pecans of the Busseron and Green River varieties, and 200 mulberry trees.

**** The trees were from the nursery of Prof. J. Russell Smith, of Swarthmore, Pa., who suggested that someone from Mr. Wildinson's (J. Ford Wilkinson of Rockport, Indiana) nursery supervise the planting of them. **** Mr. Mooney's place is the old Omar Bruther farm of 70 acres." See file under Pa.
